

Size Guide

This guide will help you choose the correct ring or bracelet size.

If you print this document to determine your ring or bracelet size, make sure that no scaling is applied during printing.

You can verify that the tools have been printed correctly by ensuring that this sample measures exactly 2 centimeters.



RINGS

It is best to measure your finger at the end of the day. Avoid taking measurements when your fingers are too warm or too cold. Please note that finger sizes may slightly vary from one hand to the other.

There are two methods to find your ring size:

Measuring your finger circuit:

1. Using a ring that already fits perfectly
2. Measuring your finger circuit to find your ring size

If you have a measuring tape, wrap it around the base of your finger and note the measurement in millimeters.

Then, refer to the size chart below and match your measurement to the closest corresponding size.

If you don't have a measuring tape, use a piece of string or a strip of paper. Wrap it around the base of your finger and mark the point where it completes the circle.

Place the string or paper flat on a surface and measure the length in millimeters using a ruler.

Using the ring size chart, match your measurement in millimeters to the closest size to determine your ring size.

Choosing Your Ring Size Using an Existing Ring

If you have a ring that fits perfectly on the finger where you will wear your Gefaell creation, you can use the ring size chart below.

Print the size chart. Before printing, make sure that no scaling is applied. Verify that size 44 measures exactly 14.01mm using a ruler.

Place your ring over the printed circles, ensuring that the inside of the ring aligns with the circle that best matches its size. This will help you determine the correct size for your ring.

If your ring size falls between two sizes, it is best to choose the larger one.

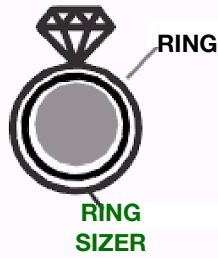
If necessary, resizing can always be done after purchase.

The inner edge of the ring is NOT aligned with the outer contour of the circle:



You should choose the smaller size.

The inner edge of the ring is NOT aligned with the outer contour of the circle:



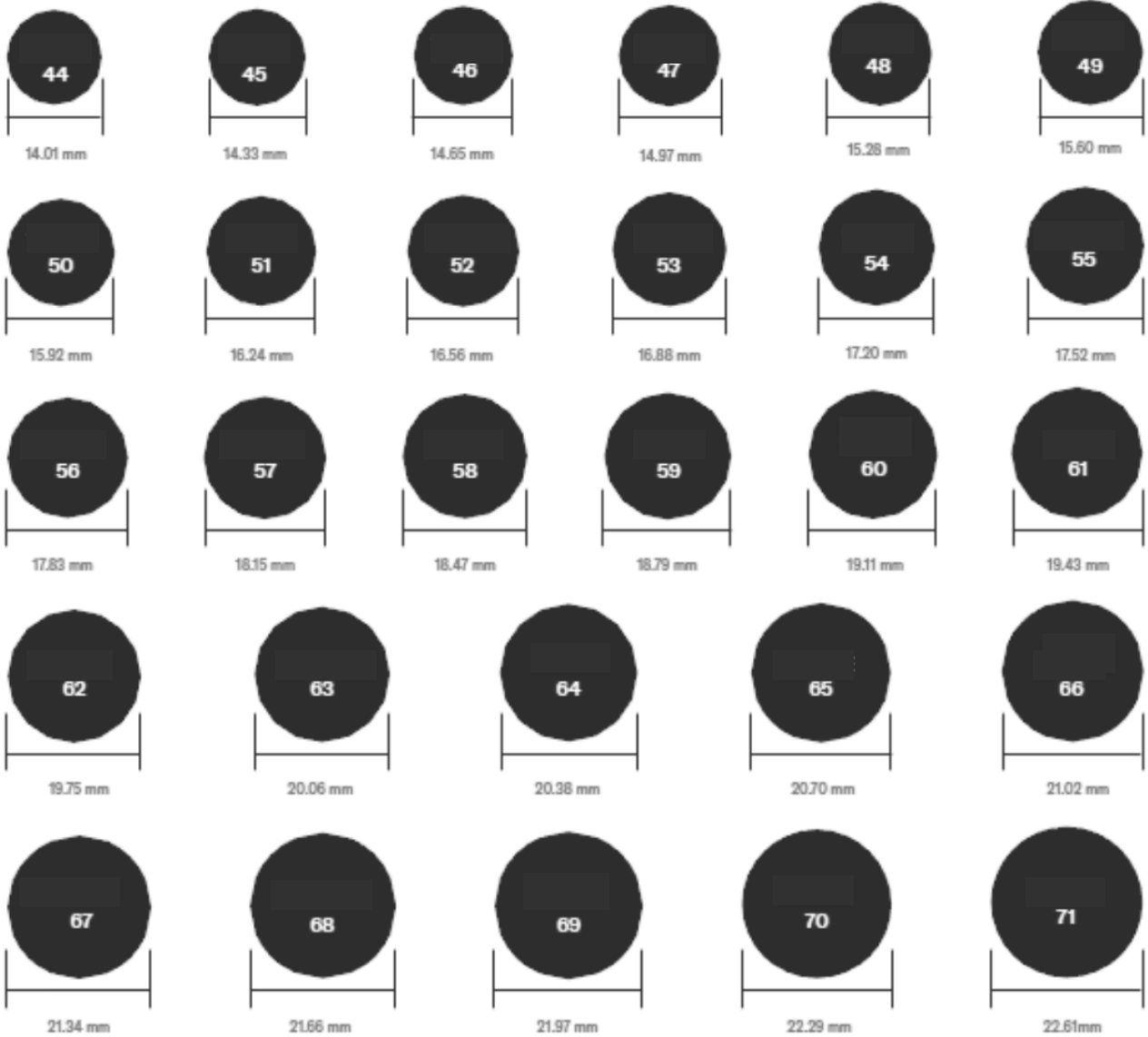
You should choose the larger size.

The inner edge of the ring is ALIGNED with the outer contour of the circle:



This is the correct size.

Philip Gefaell uses European sizes as a reference. Please refer to the size chart above to find the equivalent size in your country.



BRACELET

To find your bracelet size, there are two methods:

1. Measure your wrist circuit.
2. Use one of your bracelets that fits you well.

When choosing your bracelet size, consider your preference for wearing bracelets either snugly or comfortably. Depending on this, add or remove centimeters.

Measuring your wrist circuit to determine your bracelet size:

If you have a measuring tape, wrap it around your wrist to measure your bracelet size. Match your measurement in centimeters to the closest available size option. This will help you find the correct size for your bracelet.

If you don't have a measuring tape, take a string or a strip of paper and wrap it around your wrist.

Mark the point where the string or paper overlaps.

Lay it flat on a surface and measure the length in centimeters from the beginning of the string/paper to the marked point using a ruler.

Match your measurement in centimeters to the closest available size option. This will help you find the correct size for your bracelet.

If you want to measure your bracelet size using the "Gefaell Wrist Ruler," print the next page.

Before printing, make sure that no scaling is applied.

Cut out the ruler and adjust it around your wrist to measure your bracelet size.

Match your measurement in centimeters to the closest available size option. This will help you find the correct size for your bracelet.

Using one of your bracelets that fits you well

If you already own a bracelet that fits you perfectly, you can use it to determine the size of the bracelet you will wear for your Gefaell creation:

Place the bracelet on a flat surface

Measure the length of the bracelet from one end to its clasp.

Based on the measurement, choose your Gefaell bracelet size.
